**Crossing the Line** was a research project that ran from 2022-24 at the University of Edinburgh, directed by David Overend. Team members included Seongsook Choi, Andy Cross, Clare Cullen, David Jay (Anglia Ruskin University), Jenny Scoles and M Winter. The research was funded by the Principal's Teaching Award Scheme at the University of Edinburgh.

The project observed, documented and critically reflected on the inaugural delivery of a new undergraduate programme at Edinburgh Futures Institute (EFI). The MA (Hons) Interdisciplinary Futures launched in September 2023, preceded by a suite of pre-honours elective courses. A mixed method approach was employed to understand the holistic experience of learners and educators on a wide range of courses, as they came together to develop skills in interdisciplinary collaboration.

The project resulted in the <u>Toolkit for Interdisciplinary Learning and Teaching</u>, along with the following presentations, workshops and publications:




